Raised by American illustrator and graphic designer, Raymond Ameijide, Lisa discovered the art of paper crafting at a very young age. Lisa has continued her father's



innovative paper sculpting techniques using 3-D layering with cutouts of vibrant colored papers to bring her whimsical caricatures to life.




